Describe	Athens ASALH Black History Month program was held on Sunday February 18, 2024 in meeting room A at Athens-Clarke County Public Library. The speaker was Marie Cochran, Athens ASALH member; founder of Afrilachian Artist Project; activist/artist/educator; and former faculty at the University of Georgia Lamar Dodd School of Art. The ASALH theme in 2024 was "African Americans and the Arts", Athens ASALH presented "The Arts as Reclamation: The stories of Black Athens Artists". Marie presented the stories of Black artists in Athens, their efforts in changing the narratives about Black people in Athens. She also helped explain where participants can find arts created by these artists. The target audience was the general public as well as ASALH members and supporters; there were 45 individuals in attendance.
